

Firefighters: An Invention of Ancient Rome

Given the challenges faced by firefighters in Los Angeles while battling the ongoing wildfires, it seems both timely and fitting to honor their bravery, dedication, and commitment by looking into the origins of their profession, origins that have a very strong **Italian connection**.

Indeed, as with many foundational aspects of modern society, the concept of a dedicated firefighting force can be traced back to ancient **Rome**. The first organized firefighting unit, known as the **Vigiles Urbani** ("watchmen of the city"), was established in 6 AD by Emperor **Augustus**. Prior to this, Rome experienced frequent and devastating fires, worsened by its dense wooden structures and narrow streets. However, initial firefighting efforts were managed by private groups, which meant the safety of the community was not always paramount: a group led by **Marcus Licinius Crassus**, for instance, exploited fires for personal gain by purchasing endangered properties at reduced prices. Recognizing the need for an ethical and effective public solution, Augustus created the **Vigiles** to safeguard the city.

In addition to fighting fires, the **Vigiles** served as night watchmen, and patrolled streets to deter crime and enforce fire safety regulations. They inspected homes to ensure compliance with rules, such as maintaining accessible water supplies, and acted as a deterrent to criminal activity. Their responsibilities extended to apprehending thieves and runaway slaves, which reflected their dual role in maintaining both safety and public order.



The establishment of the **Vigiles** was a fundamental step in urban management, as their methods laid the groundwork for modern firefighting organizations all around the world. Their equipment was advanced for the time, featuring hand-operated water pumps (*siphon*) to project water onto flames; buckets made from rope sealed with pitch to transport water;

and hooks (*uncini*) and axes (*dolabre*) to demolish nearby structures and prevent fire from spreading. Soaked blankets (*centones*) were also used to smother flames.
